Application of safeguard measures to imports originating in developing country members

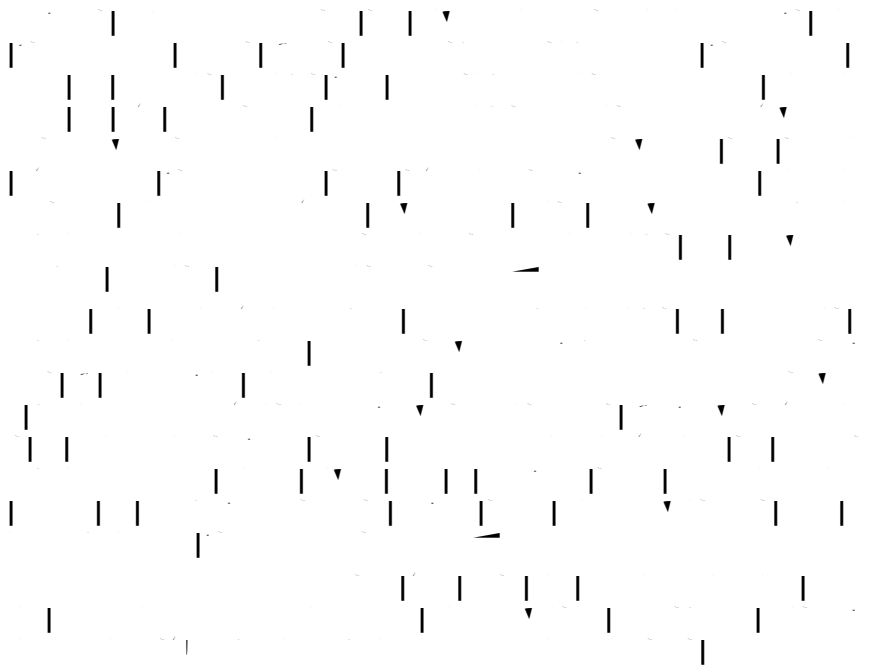

Agreement on Trade Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPS)

1. Recognition of general interests

Recognizing that intellectual property rights are private rights, that they confer certain exclusive rights on their holders, and that they are subject to national laws and procedures, the Agreement shall be implemented in a manner which supports and safeguards the public interest, in particular the interests of small-scale and developing countries, and in particular the interests of the least developed countries.
