- Recent study on TO effectiveness is critical of the existing literature (Chaudoin, Hays and Hicks, 014):
 - Do we really know that the WTO cures cancer?
 - Memhership in CITES and WTO equally promote trade
 - More interdisciplinary micro-evidence is needed



- Maybe the mistake of the past was to focus on low-hanging fruits....




Inequality and new trade theory
