

MERCHANDISE TRADE

The United States of America recorded the strongest year-on-year growth of merchandise exports in September (24%) while Japan recorded a negative growth (-1%). On the import side, growth slowed for all major traders and declined by 1% for the United Kingdom.

TRADE IN COMMERCIAL SERVICES

India showed the highest growth of exports of commercial service (30%) in September 2022. On the import side, China, Japan and the Republic of Korea recorded negative growth, while India continued to record the largest growth (28%).
