By virtue of paragraph 3 Article 60 of the Veterinary Law ("Official Gazette of RM" No. 11/04), the Government of the Republic of Montenegro, at its session held on the 7th July 2003, passed this

DECISION

ON THE LEVEL OF COMPENSATION FOR VETERINARY-SANITARY CONTROL IN THE TRADE ACROSS THE BORDER OF THE REPUBLIC OF MONTENEGRO

Article 1

This decision regulates the level of the compensation for mandatory veterinary-sanitary control at the border crossings of the Republic of Montenegro, in export, import, and transit of the consignments of animals, foodstuffs, raw materials, animal products, animal by-products, and wastes of animal origin.

1. Level of the compensation for consignments by truck, railway wagon, ship, container, or by air is as follows:
 - a) for consignments of equine and cloven-hoofed animals in the transport unit, in the case of:
 - export of up to 10 tons net mass – EUR 5.00 and thereafter for each following ton or any part of such quantity – EUR 1.00;
 - import of up to 10 tons net mass – EUR 20.00 and thereafter for each following ton or any part of such quantity – EUR 3.00;
 - transit of up to 10 tons net mass – EUR 5.00 and thereafter for each following ton or any part of such quantity – EUR 2.00;
 - b) for consignments of poultry, birds, rabbits, and game, and apes for laboratory examinations, in the transport unit, in the case of:
 - export of up to 5 tons net mass – EUR 5.00 and thereafter for each following ton or any part of such quantity – EUR 1.00;
 - import of up to 5 tons net mass – EUR 20.00 and thereafter for each following ton or any part of such quantity – EUR 3.00;
 - transit of up to 5 tons net mass – EUR 5.00 and thereafter for each following ton or any part of such quantity – EUR 2.00;

c) for consignments of one day old poultry (chickens, turkey, geese, ducks, etc.) in the transport unit, in the case of:

- transit– EUR 15.00;

b)

the border to examine the consignment and the importer comes to the place of examination at the arranged time, the importer, exporter or transiter, or their representative, shall pay EUR 15.00 for each hour of keeping the inspector on hold.

Article 6

The level of compensation for the veterinary-sanitary control referred to in Article 1, items 1 to 3 of this Decision, if conducted outside the inspectors' working hours at night, on non-working days or statutory holidays, the level of compensation shall be increased by 50%.

The work at night, in the context of paragraph 1 of this Article, shall be construed to mean the work between 22:00 and 06:00.

Article 7

In the event that veterinary-sanitary control is conducted outside the veterinary inspection registered office, the transportation costs incurred by the veterinary inspector who have conducted the control shall be paid separately.

Article 8

Compensation for mandatory veterinary-sanitary control shall be paid by the applicant.

The compensation referred to in paragraph 1 of this Article shall be paid to the incoming payment account of the budget of the Republic of Montenegro, No. -832 -6142 -07.

Article 9

On the day of coming into force of this Decision, provisions of Article 4 paragraph 2, 3 and 5, and Articles 8 and 9 of the Decision on the Level of Compensation for Veterinary-Sanitary Control of Animals, and Products, Raw Materials and Wastes of Animal Origin in the Production and on the Market ("Official Gazette of RM" No. 51/2003).

Article 10

This Decision shall come into force on the eighth day after its publication in the "Official Gazette of the Republic of Montenegro".
