## Introduction

Before the current Customs legislation, in Cà/pærde, centuries agpayments for services rendered by customs officials befoor after the normal workintigme were paid by customs users requesting such services.

Nowadays, the current Customs Organiat Ste, approved by the Decree No. 43199 of 29 September 1960, establishes tolkowing in its article 278:

«The overtime services rendered to the reimages ustoms users, before or after the normal working time within the customs Houses or oddesithe Customs House zone at anytime will be charged to such requesting users as emoluments of operation and other allowances for transports, accommodations and meals, according to the approace established by Ministerial Ordinance».

Outside the customs house, suservices can only be extremally authorized and rendered within the normal working time.

The accommodation and meal allowances intrestpaid according to the same provisions generally applied within the Public Administration.

The services rendered by customs officials concern to:

- services rendered to ships and airplanes;
- custody, watching and checking of loading unloading goods, customs warehouses, ports, airports, roads, shipmirplanes and territorial sea;
- Verification and revertication of goods.

As air and shipping companies from 1978 onwsarrelfused to pay charges for loading and unloading of their ships and planes, for conveyance offs within the port and airports, as well as other charges and other customs services rendes redustoms, ports and airports officials, the government published the Ministerial Ordinarriale. 71/78 of 14 of October 1978 amending the former Ministerial Ordinance No. 6238/61 of 28 Nonleer 1968. In its turn, the Ministerial Ordinance No. 23/79 of 27 April 1979 amended the Ministerial Ordinance No. 71/78. By Ministerial Ordinance oluments for the personnel were integrated in the

The total amount collected on expense of remunerations for resides rendered by particular customs users, according to Ministerial Ordina Nove 29/91 of 28 August 1991, is classified in two categories:

- customs users fee of 1.04 %d-valoremon imported goods transported by sea, and
- other customer users' fees.

customs staffs' salary while they were collected.

The above include both emoluments those personnel and other allowances.

Of this total amount, there are:

- the emoluments for the personneling the constitutes: budgetary revenue,
- travel allowances, accommodation and mexpenses which are paid directly to the customs officials by the Customs House.

Of the 1.04%ad-valoremoustoms users' fees, 0.28 % goesemoluments for the personnel. The remaining 0.76 % is affected for direct payment for customs officials. In conclusion:
