

DECREE OF THE PRESIDENT OF GEORGIA

On the Right of Admission of Goods Received from the Republic of Georgia, and the Right of Georgia to their Return

In accordance with the Law No 309-11 of 1996 of Georgia on Taxation of Goods and Cash Reserves Received from Georgia # and the Decree of the President of Georgia No 577 of September 3, 1996 on Approval of the Procedure of the Ministry of Finance of Georgia #:

1. The procedure of the payment of Georgia shall be determined by the Ministry of Finance of Georgia, including the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of Economic Relations of Georgia.
2. The basic principle of payment of the tax shall be agreed between the government and the receiver of the goods on the basis of which the procedure of the goods cash is determined.

LAW OF GEORGIA ON GRANTS

CHAPTER I. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

ARTICLE 1. SPHERE OF APPLICATION.

This law shall apply to all persons who receive, except as provided in this Code, a grant from the State of Georgia.

ARTICLE 2. GRANT.

1. A grant is a transfer of property, whether real or personal, for a specific purpose, made by the State of Georgia, or any agency thereof, to an individual or a corporation, partnership, or other legal entity, for the benefit of the State or its citizens.

2. Reserves transferred to a grantee shall be held in trust for the purposes for which they were transferred.

ARTICLE 3. DONOR.

A donor is:

1. A charitable, humanitarian or religious organization, institution, or association, or a governmental entity, or a corporation, partnership, or other legal entity, which is organized and operated exclusively for the promotion of the public interest.

2. The Georgia State Board of Education, or any agency thereof, or any other agency of the State of Georgia, or any agency thereof, which is organized and operated exclusively for the promotion of the public interest.

4. GRANTEE.

A grantee is:

1. A State agency created by the President of Georgia.

2. State Governmental agency created by the President of Georgia.

3. Religious or educational institution, or any other agency of the State of Georgia, or any agency thereof, which is organized and operated exclusively for the promotion of the public interest.
