ANIMAL AND PLANT BIOSECURITY ACT, 2012

Animal and Plant Biosecurity (Plant) Regulations, 2012

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 146 of the Animal and Plant Biosecurity Act, 2012, the Minister for Investment, Natural Resources and Industry makes the following Regulations –

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Animal and Plant Biosecurity (Plant) Regulations, 2012.

Citation

2. In these Regulations –

Interpretation

“agency responsible for biosecurity” means the agency designated as such under section 10 of the Act;

“Chief Plant Protection Officer” means a person appointed as such under section 23(1)(a) of the Act;

“international reporting requirements” means the obligations of the national plant protection organisation to report on the status of pests and diseases to competent international authorities and national authorities of trading partners under the provisions –

(a) for transparency in the Agreement on the Application of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures;

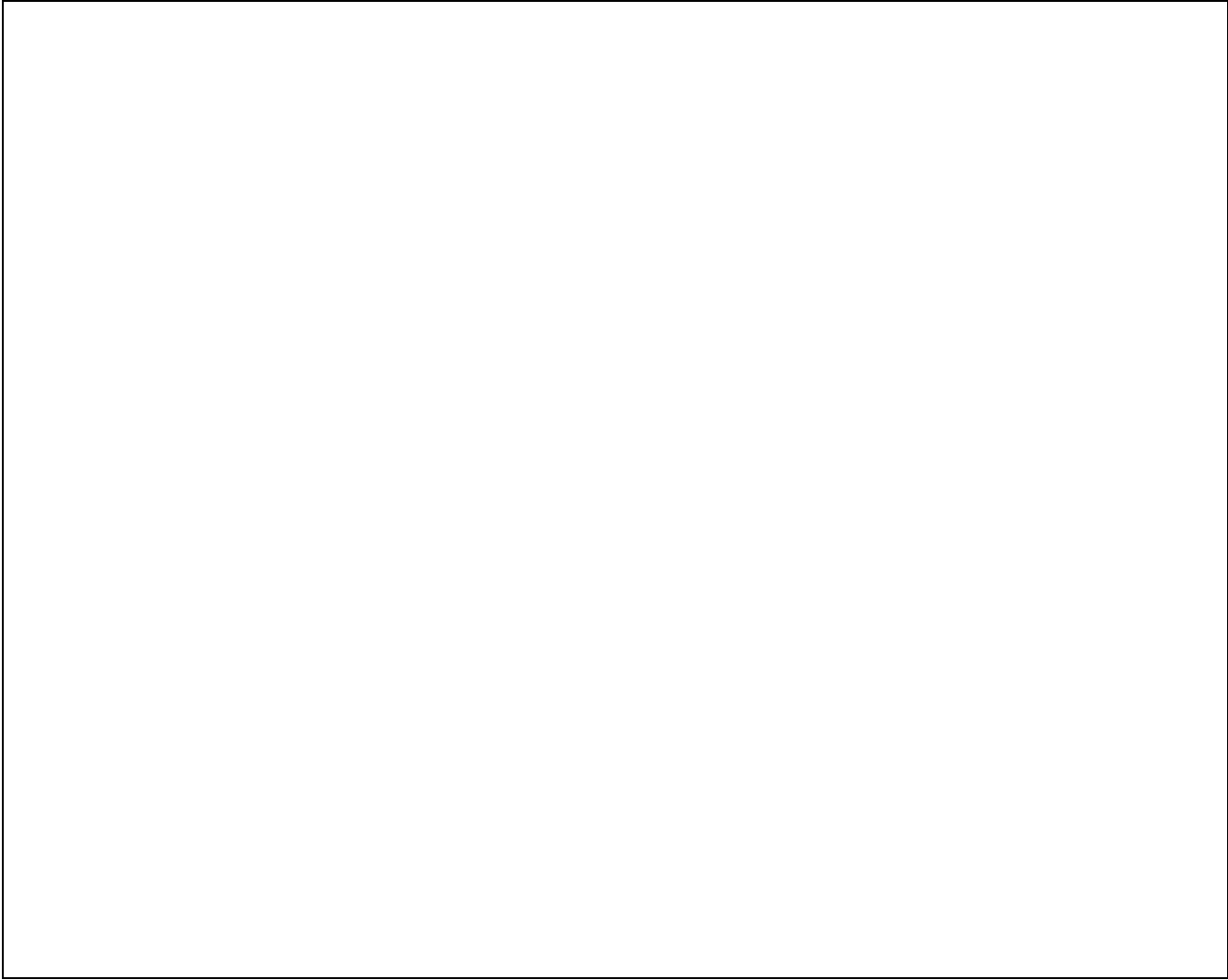
(b) of the International Plant Protection Convention; and

(c) of other international and regional agreements and treaties to which Seychelles is signatory;

“IPPC” means the International Plant Protection Convention;
