Protection Convention adopted on 6th December, 1951 at Rome and includes amendment thereto;

“national plant protection organisation” means the Seychelles Agricultural Agency designated by the President under section 4 of the Act.

Identification marks

3. A biosecurity officer may, for the purposes of the Act, apply or cause to be applied an identification mark to an animal, animal product, container, premises, equipment, vehicle or aircraft.

Surety

4.(1) The master of an incoming vessel or captain of an incoming aircraft which has on board a live animal for which no permission has been granted to remain in the Republic shall execute a bond with the Government in the amount of SCR10,000 to ensure that the animal is on board the vessel or aircraft leaves Seychelles in compliance with section 46 (3) of the Act.

(2) The amount of the bond entered into pursuant to subregulation (1) shall be reimbursed upon confirmation that the animal on board the vessel or aircraft has left Seychelles.

Chief Veterinary Officer to be official contact

5. The Chief Veterinary Officer shall be the official contact for the purposes of the fulfillment of Seychelles' obligations under the World Organisation for Animal Health.

6. The Chief Plant Protection Officer shall be the official contact point for the purposes of the fulfillment of Seychelles' obligations under the Convention.

7. The Seychelles Agricultural Agency shall be the national plant protection organisation for Seychelles for the purposes of fulfillment of Seychelles' obligations under any international and regional agreements and treaties to which it is signatory and in particular the International Plant Protection Convention.

8.(1) The Agency shall comply with all international reporting requirements under the international and regional agreements and treaties in accordance with these regulations, for the fulfillment of Seychelles' obligations under those agreements.

(2) The Agency shall provide the following information to the IPPC Secretariat and other contracting parties to the Convention in pursuant to Seychelles' obligations under the International Plant Protection Convention —

- (a) the contact point for Seychelles for the exchange of information connected with the implementation of the Convention;
- (b) official pest reports on plant pests in particular on the occurrence, outbreak or spread of pests that may be of immediate or potential danger;
- (c) a description of the Agency and changes made in the constitution of the in Agency;
- (d) written laws in Seychelles establishing phytosanitary requirements, restrictions and prohibitions;
- (e) points of entry in Seychelles through which particular plants or plant products are required to be imported;
- (f) a list of regulated pests; and
- (g) emergency actions taken on the detection of a pest posing a potential threat to Seychelles or the report of such a detection.

(3) The Seychelles Agricultural Agency may, on request, provide information on the following —

- (a) any significant instances of non-compliance with phytosanitary certification;
- (b) a description of its organizational arrangements for plant protection;
- (c) pest status; or
- (d) the rationale for phytosanitary requirements, restrictions and prohibitions adopted by Seychelles.

9. A phytosanitary certificate issued pursuant to section 120(1) of the Act shall be in the form specified in the Schedule.
