Existing WTO rules should be further developed and improved in order to better address the reality and needs of the current world trade. We should therefore look beyond the DDA mandate and should also tackle such important elements related to global trade as digital economy and e-commerce, investments, export restrictions or other emerging issues not addressed within the WTO framework yet.

Active and constructive participation and strong sense of responsibility is needed from all WTO Members States, reflecting their respective positions in the world economy and their different capacities to contribute to the system.

We believe our collective wisdom will help us to agree on such a post-Nairobi working program that will preserve WTO as a modern and
