Using the initial guiding question "What are the most impactful public policies that the private sector and governments can successfully put forward to facilitate and assist entrepreneurs and MSMEs, among others, to enter global markets sustainably?", the session aims not only to present these practices but also to hear about other countries' practices, in an effort to build a toolkit of key measures that can be easily replicated in other developing countries.

Featured speakers include entrepreneurs that have benefitted from green financing, agro-exporting MSMEs, officials from public and non-governmental agencies dedicated to cooperation in agriculture, and experts in bioeconomy and nationally appropriate mitigation actions (NAMA).
