14. Technology transfer undeniably plays a vital role in the overall development of a country. Institutional linkage between our local research **inte**ins and that of intentional organizations needs to be more deeply rooted.

15. Although Article 66.2 of the TRIPS Agreenterequires developed country Members to provide incentives to encourage technology trantsferDCs for the purpose of capacity building, its enforceability remains a problem.
